

Instructions for Authors – Tamansiswa Accounting Journal

Tamansiswa Accounting Journal welcomes **original research articles, case studies, and analytical reviews** in the field of accounting, finance, and economics. Authors must follow the submission guidelines outlined below to ensure a smooth peer-review and publication process.

1. Manuscript Preparation

Format & Structure

- Manuscripts must be written in **English** with **clear, academic language**.
- Submissions should be in **Microsoft Word format (.doc or .docx)** using **Times New Roman, 12 pt**, with **1.5 line spacing**.

Include structured sections:

- Title Page
- Abstract (150–250 words)
- Keywords (3–5)
- Introduction
- Methodology
- Results & Discussion
- Conclusion
- References

Length Requirements

- **Original Research Articles:** 5,000–8,000 words
- **Case Studies:** 3,000–6,000 words
- **Short Reviews:** 2,000–4,000 words

2. Citation & Referencing Style

- Use **APA 7th Edition** for in-text citations and references.
- Ensure all sources are properly cited to maintain ethical academic standards.

3. Ethical Compliance & Plagiarism Policy

- All manuscripts must be **original** and **free from plagiarism** (checked via Turnitin, similarity below 25%).
- Authors must **disclose any conflicts of interest** related to their research.
- Submissions must comply with **COPE (Committee on Publication Ethics) guidelines**.

4. Submission & Review Process

- Manuscripts should be submitted via the **journal's official submission portal** or email. The journal follows a **double-anonymous peer-review process**, ensuring fair and unbiased evaluation.
